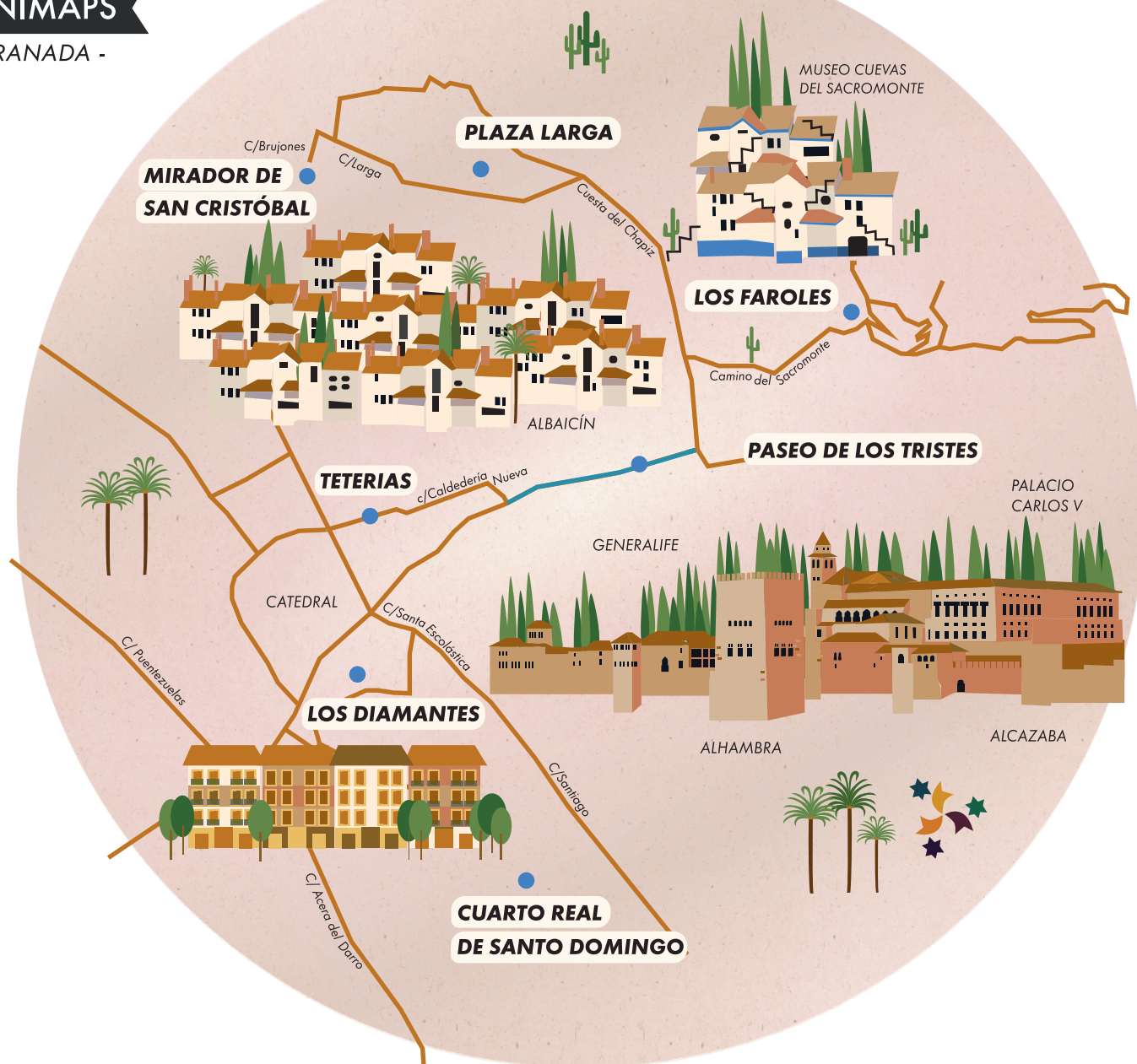

### 1. CUARTO REAL DE SANTO DOMINGO

A 13th-century Moorish palace that belonged to Axa, the mother of King Boabdil. It features a qubba and some original excavations. We bump into it by mere chance and it turned out to be a really peaceful place with lovely gardens and contemporary art or history exhibitions.

### 2. LOS DIAMANTES

Massive generous tapas, fresh and delicious seafood in a packed but ultra nice ambience. That's Los Diamantes.

Old one: Calle Navas, 26 - Opens: 12h30-16h30 / 20h30-00h  
New one: Plaza Nueva 13 - Opens: 12h30-00h

### 3. LAS TETERÍAS DEL ALBAICÍN

Around this area you'll have a galore of Tea Rooms moorish style to chose from. Many styles, all pure charm and many young people, both native Spanish and foreign including many students.

Calle Calderería Nueva, also called Calle de las Teterías.

### 4. EL PASEO DE LOS TRISTES

Lovely area, if the sun is shining this is the best place to enjoy the sun and some beers. It's hard to be sunkissed in Granada because of the tangled nature of its streets but here, next to the small water stream, there are many terraces with enough sun for everyone. Enjoy!

### 5. PLAZA LARGA

Down-to-earth / less-touristic bars to enjoy the ridiculously generous tapas that Granada have to offer. Hanging out with the locals you'll discover many town secrets.

### 6. MIRADOR DE SAN CRISTÓBAL

When going up the Albaicín you'll always have the omnipresent Alhambra right on your back, you can enjoy that sight from the Mirador San Nicolás, but if you also want to have a look at the city this is the place. Sunset, as usual, is recommended time.

### 7. LOS FAROLES CUEVA DE ARTE

Mini-cave with just a bunch of chairs outside to fit 8 to 12 people, a limited menu, but with the most stories per meter square. An eclectic and wonderful place hosted by its owner: Romántico.
