1. ROSETO COMUNALE

It's one of the most romantic ones and definitely the most perfumed: 1 100 types of roses, and you get the most spectacular views over the Palatine hill and Circus Maximus.

2. TERME DI DIOCLEZIANO

A secret spot, better than Termini, to wait for your train: cross the piazza and enter the beautiful garden of the museum Terme di Diocleziano. Magnificent views.

3. ORTO BOTANICO

Never crowded, it's the most beautiful garden in the centre of Rome, with its amazing palm trees, bamboo forest, japanese garden and lovely views.

4. PALATINE

Only a few find the way to San Sebastiano al Palatino: a Tuscan landscape that offers an absolutely breathtaking view over the Colosseo.

5. IL GIARDINO DI PALAZZO BARBERINI

Behind the Palazzo, and their wonderful masterpieces of Raphael & Caravage the stairs drive to a beautiful Italian garden with lemon trees called "Giardino segreto"!

6. VILLA ALDOBRANDINI

Incredible suspended garden with all the Roman essentials: palm trees, statues, orange & lemon trees, and breathtaking view over Rome.

7. CASA DELLA LETTERATURA

Hidden and mini. After crossing the library, you'll get to a patio with orange trees...Take a book and sit at the foot of the magnificent Borromini's Torre dell'orologio, right in the center of Rome... but without tourists!
